DANVILLE/PITTSYLVANIA COUNTY VETERANS MEMORIAL

QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE PLACEMENT OF NAMES ON THE WALL.

- The honored individual must have been a resident of the City of Danville or any community or area within the established physical boundaries of the County of Pittsylvania, Virginia at the time their military service commenced and died while on active duty in combat or from other causes.
- A resident is defined as someone whose permanent home was within the confines of the above named jurisdictions. Residents of other jurisdictions who changed their permanent home to these local jurisdictions at or before the time of their commencement of military service are considered residents. These qualifications are further defined as:
- Persons who grew up in the City of Danville or any community or area within the established
 physical boundaries of Pittsylvania County but, who had established permanent residences elsewhere
 at the time of their commencement of military service, are <u>NOT</u> qualified for their names to be placed
 on the Memorial Wall except when extenuating circumstances presented to a qualified committee
 prove otherwise.
- Persons reared elsewhere other than the City of Danville or any community or area within the
 established physical boundaries of Pittsylvania County and who established a permanent residence in
 the said City or County prior to entering military service <u>ARE</u> considered residents and are eligible to
 have their name engraved on the wall if killed in action or died from other causes while on active
 military duty.
- Persons whose legal residence was in the said City or County and who left to work on a temporary
 job or to attend college and did not establish a permanent home address elsewhere <u>ARE</u> considered
 residents and are eligible to have their names engraved on the wall if killed in action or died from
 other causes while on active military duty.
