Board President's Message





Characteristics That Define Us

The Community Foundation of the Dan River Region serves as a builder and caretaker of permanent community resources; a service provider to donors; a grant maker; and a convener, catalyst, and collaborator within the community.

The Community Foundation is a publicly supported philanthropic institution. We grow because our donors—individuals, corporations, other nonprofits and government entities—believe in our organization and contribute to our continual development.

Substantial lifetime gifts or bequests as well as a wide-range of public contributions are needed to propel and increase The Foundation's grant making capacity.

Neither contributions from our donors, nor grants awarded by The Community Foundation for the benefit of the residents of our defined geographic service area, are limited to one area of charitable benefit. Our organization focuses on the well-being of the entire community through our grant making processes. Sectors where we make a big difference include Emergency Preparedness, Animal Services, Arts and Culture, Community Development, Health and Wellness, Education and Youth Development, Human Services and Scholarships.

The Community Foundation is not controlled

by a single family, business, political or other limited group, but rather by a board of directors drawn from a broad community base. The board is currently composed of 22 members, most of whom serve two, three-year consecutive terms.

Establish Your Endowed Fund

Our forever endowed funds are great giving options. You choose the fund type that is right for you. Types of funds include: Unrestricted, Field of Interest, Designated, Donor Advised, Agency Endowment, Community Partnerships, and Scholarships. Establishing a fund is a straightforward and simple process. The required establishing gift for an endowed fund is \$10,000 and for a scholarship it is \$25,000. If an individual or organization requires time to grow their fund balance to reach this minimum, we offer Acorn Funds, which allow the donor a three-year period to reach the minimum required fund balance.

Plan a Legacy Gift

Planned giving, or legacy giving, is the act of making a significant gift during life or planning to leave a gift as part of your overall financial or estate plan. It is typically motivated by a desire to make an enduring impact on causes you care deeply about. Planned gifts may offer substantial financial, tax, and estate planning benefits while supporting the vital work of nonprofits across our communities. While most planned gifts provide future support, such as bequests in wills or living trusts, some planned gifts provide current support, such as gifts of real estate. For more complicated gifts, it is always best to consult with your financial or legal advisor and a representative from The Community Foundation to ensure your gift is accepted and honored as intended.

Legacy Society

Our 1996 Legacy Society recognizes people who have generously left a gift to The Community Foundation in their will or estate plan. Donors who notify us of their plans receive special recognition. Making a legacy gift is easy and flexible. It can be adjusted at any time in the future, if necessary. The Foundation does not ask the amount of your intended gift. Donors may choose to remain anonymous, however, we encourage you to share your name as an inspiration to others to look toward the future. Your generosity as a Legacy Society donor is a permanent reminder of your values. It represents your extraordinary commitment to ensuring every community member—across generations—can thrive!



End-of-Year Giving CHECKLIST

☐ Talk to your tax advisor.
Before making any significant gift to charity, consult with your tax advisor to understand the most efficient way to fulfill your philanthropic goals and for advice on your specific tax situation.
□ Consider your income.
Take time to understand your tax liability for the year. Did your unearned income increase? Did you sell any appreciated assets? The answers to these questions may determine how much you want to give by December 31. If you itemize your deductions, cash gifts are deductible up to 60% of your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI).
□ Review your stocks.
Consider giving appreciated stock. Selling stock will incur capital gains on the appreciation, but if you gift stock, you will receive a charitable deduction for the current fair market value of the stock—just as you would with a cash gift. Plus, you can carry the deduction forward for up to five additional years. Appreciated stock gifts to any type of fund are deductible up to 30% of your AGI.
☐ Give early and complete your gift by December 31.
A gift by check is complete when postmarked to the charitable recipient, even if not cashed until the following year. Gifts of stock and real estate are more complex; do not wait to make these gifts as it may take additional time to make necessary arrangements.
☐ Give online.
Giving online through www.cfdrr.org ensures your gift is received immediately. A gift to The Community Foundation supports grant making to benefit the entire community. You can also search for Community Foundation funds on our website to learn of our funds that support local nonprofits and special causes that are meaningful to you.
☐ Give from your IRA.
Speak with a tax advisor about an IRA rollover gift. Please note that the distribution must be sent directly to us from your IRA administrator. IRA distributions cannot be given to donor advised funds but can be gifted to any other type of fund.
☐ Give now—create a legacy fund.
